**Israeli violations, acts of aggression and other activities from 16 to
30 November 2009**

Air violations

On 16 November 2009, between 0700 and 1135 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north as far as Beirut and circled over Beirut and the southern regions before leaving over Alma al-Sha'b.

On 18 November 2009:

- Between 0915 and 1515 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Kafr Killa. It proceeded north and circled over all Lebanese regions before leaving over Rumaysh;
- Between 1322 and 1500 hours, two Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Kafr Killa. They proceeded north as far as Tripoli before leaving over Alma al-Sha'b.

On 19 November 2009:

- Between 0720 and 1505 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It circled over the southern regions before leaving over Naqurah;
- Between 0820 and 1630 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Alma al-Sha'b. It circled over Beirut, Riyaq and Baalbek before leaving over Rumaysh.

On 20 November 2009:

- Between 1030 and 1100 hours, eight Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace as follows: six entered over Naqurah and two entered over Alma al-Sha'b. They proceeded north-east as far as Hirmil and circled over all Lebanese regions. Two of the warplanes left over Naqurah and the remaining six over the sea off Naqurah;
- Between 1035 and 1055 hours, four Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over the sea off Juniyah. They proceeded east as far as Hirmil and circled over all Lebanese regions before leaving over the sea off Naqurah;
- Between 1107 and 1128 hours, two Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Kafr Killa. They proceeded north as far as Shikka before heading south and leaving over Alma al-Sha'b;
- Between 0730 and 1900 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north and circled over the South before leaving over Naqurah.

On 21 November 2009, between 0710 and 1900 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Rumaysh. It circled over the southern regions before leaving over Naqurah.

On 22 November 2009:

- Between 0705 and 1025 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It circled over Riyaq and Baalbek before leaving over Rumaysh;
- Between 1105 and 1115 hours, two Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over the sea off Shikka. They proceeded south over the sea to a point five miles off Jubayl before heading in the direction of Turkey.

On 23 November 2009:

- Between 1015 and 1145 hours, six Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Kafr Killa. They proceeded north and circled over all Lebanese regions before leaving over Alma al-Sha‘b;
- Between 0915 and 1730 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Rumaysh. It circled over the South before leaving over Alma al-Sha‘b.

On 24 November 2009:

- Between 0710 and 1035 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north and circled over the southern region and then between Beirut and the South before leaving over the sea off Naqurah;
- Between 0745 and 1040 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Alma al-Sha‘b. It proceeded north and circled over the southern region and then between Beirut and the South before leaving over the sea off Naqurah;
- Between 1030 and 1120 hours, four Israeli enemy warplanes violated Lebanese airspace, entering over the sea off Shikka. They proceeded east and circled over all Lebanese regions before leaving over Rumaysh.

On 26 November 2009:

- Between 0703 and 1005 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Alma al-Sha‘b. It proceeded north as far as eastern Sidon. It then circled over the South before leaving over Rumaysh;
- At 0703 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north as far as Nabatiyah and circled over the South before leaving over Rumaysh on 27 November 2009 at 0325 hours.

On 27 November 2009:

- Between 0930 and 1700 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north and circled over the southern region before leaving over Alma al-Sha‘b.

On 28 November 2009, between 0710 and 1320 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It circled over the southern regions before leaving over Alma al-Sha'b.

On 29 November 2009, between 0710 and 2335 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Naqurah. It proceeded north and circled over the South before leaving over Naqurah.

On 30 November 2009, between 0700 and 1500 hours, an Israeli enemy reconnaissance aircraft violated Lebanese airspace, entering over Alma al-Sha'b. It proceeded north and circled over the southern regions before leaving over Rumaysh.

Land violations

On 16 November 2009:

- At 1730 hours, the Israeli enemy directed a searchlight for three seconds from its position at the Zar'it barracks towards the Tarbikha gate;
- At 1743 hours, the Israeli enemy directed a searchlight for 25 seconds from its position at the Zar'it barracks towards the Lebanese Army position in Jabal Balat;
- At 2005 hours, the Israeli enemy directed a searchlight for 10 seconds from its position at the Zar'it barracks towards the 613th Company command post in Jabal Balat and the Lebanese Army roadblock at Tarbikha.

On 17 November 2009, at 1830 hours, the Israeli enemy directed a searchlight for five seconds from its position at the Zar'it barracks towards the 613th Company command post in Jabal Balat and the Lebanese Army roadblock at Tarbikha.

On 21 November 2009, at 2000 hours, from within the occupied Palestinian territory opposite Fatimah Gate, the members of an Israeli enemy patrol, consisting of an M113 armoured personnel carrier and two jeeps, hurled insults at persons passing a Lebanese Army sentry. The patrol then departed.

On 23 November 2009:

- At 1145 hours, from within the occupied Palestinian territory opposite the Kafr Killa crossing point, an Israeli enemy patrol hurled insults in Arabic at a Lebanese Army sentry;
- Between 1147 and 1600 hours, a number of phone calls originating from abroad were received on civilian landline phones. The calls, which were made by the Israeli enemy, stated that \$10 million would be paid to anyone who provided information regarding the Israeli soldiers missing in Lebanon.

On 24 November 2009, at 1000 hours, a number of phone calls originating from abroad were received on civilian landline phones. The calls, which were made by the Israeli enemy, stated that \$10 million would be paid to anyone who provided information regarding the Israeli pilot missing in Lebanon.

On 25 November 2009, at 1600 hours, a number of phone calls originating from abroad were received on civilian landline phones. On 27 November 2009, between 0700 and 1100 hours, a number of phone calls originating from abroad were received on civilian landline phones.
